Tools of State Power



Personnel – 20 million employees - > 70 % of organized workers

Public Money

- Rs.1800 crores/day
- only 5 % GDP spent on education, health and social security

Distortions of State Power

- Positive Power restricted Negative power unchecked
- All organs are dysfunctional
- A system of alibis Victims of a vicious cycle
- Change of players No change in the rules of the game
- Political process ought to be the solution But has become the problem itself

Gandhiji's Talisman

Will it restore him to a control over his own life and destiny? In other words, will it lead to Swaraj for the hungry and spiritually starving millions?

Then you will find your doubts and yourself melting away" - Gandhiji
